About the College......

Srikishan Sarda College, Hailakandi, was established on 18th September 1950. It is one of the premier institutions of higher education and providing quality education to the students of the district of Hailakandi and also the students from surrounding districts and neighbouring states as well. The college is situated at a very convenient place of Hailakandi with all sorts of transport facilities.

The donor of the land of the college was Late Pratap Chandra Nath and the founder Principal of the college was Late Sisir Kar Shastri. Initially the college was started with Arts Stream and it was affiliated to Gauhati University in the year 1956. The college started progressing by leaps and bounds and in course of time science stream was opened to cater to the needs of the students. Since its humble beginning, the college has been endeavouring hard to spread the light of higher education among the students and to lift the humanity from the bog and morass of ignorance. At present the college is equipped with Classrooms alongwith Smart Classroom, Science laboratories, Auditorium hall, Computer laboratories, Seminar hall, Central library, NSS., Sports Cell, Health Services, NCC and experienced faculty members.

The college is now affiliated to Assam University, Silchar, a Central University constituted under the Act XII of parliament in the year 1994. The College has been re-accredited as Grade 'A' with CGPA 3.12 by the NAAC in 2011.

College has been supported with Advance level Biotech Hub by Department of Biotechnology, Govt of India. Moreover, department of Science and Technology (DST) has extended its academic support to the science department of the college under its North East Special FIST programme.



- N.B. (a): A Student can also opt any one of the above four subject as fourth optional

For FYUG Program,

Guidelines for Four Year Undergraduate (UG) Programme as per National Education Policy-2020

UG curriculum framework shall be a Four Year UG programme (FYUG) as per curriculum structure provided in ANNEXURE-I. Students may choose FYUG programme either with Honours or Honours with research in concerned discipline. After successful completion of six semesters (3rd Year) of study in chosen discipline, students will have the option to opt honours in concerned discipline. If student chooses honours with research option in 4th year, then the qualifying criterion is that he /she should obtain minimum 7.5 CGPA upto 3rd year with no arrear papers. For only Honours degree there shall not be any CGPA restriction. But students with arrear paper shall not be allowed to move to 4th year in any case. Students opting for research project/dissertation will be given Honours with Research degree and students opting for additional three Discipline Specific core papers in lieu of Project/Dissertation will be given Honours degree.

- •For FYUG Programme, total credit requirement across eight semesters is 160 of which Discipline Specific Core (DSC) 80, Discipline Specific Minor (DSM) 34, Inter-disciplinary Course (IDC) 9, Ability Enhancement Course (AEC) 8, Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) 9, Internship 2, Value Added Course (VAC) 6, Research Project/ Dissertation/ Additional 03 courses DSC 12.
- •As there is a provision of lateral entry and exit, if student exits after three years then total credit requirement for Three Years Undergraduate (TYUG) Programme is 120 of which Discipline Specific Core (DSC) -60, Discipline Specific Minor (DSM) -26, Inter-disciplinary Course (IDC) -9, Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC) -8, Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) -9, Internship -2, Value Added Course (VAC) -6.
- If a student exits after completion of Semester II (i.e., 1st year) and successfully obtain 40 credits, then university will provide him/her Certificate in relevant discipline.
- If a student exits after completion of Semesters IV (i.e., 2nd year) and successfully obtain 80 credits, then university will provide him/her Diploma in relevant discipline.
- If a student exits after completion of Semester VI (i.e., 3rd year) and successfully obtain 120 credits, then university will provide him/her Three Years UG Degree in relevant discipline.
- In S. S. College, following departments will offer FYUG programme (Honours only/ Honours with Research) English, Bengali, Sanskrit, Persian, Manipuri, History, Political Science, Philosophy, Economics, Mathematics, Statistics, Physics, Chemistry, Zoology, Botany and Commerce.
- •For opting DSC and DSM combination, clustering of subjects shall be as per ANNEXURE-III. Both DSC and DSM should be selected from the same cluster. Same subject cannot be selected as DSC and DSM. DSC from one cluster and DSM from another cluster are not allowed.
- Students shall have to opt for two DSM, one as first minor and the other as second minor. For DSM, students shall have to take two subjects related to his /her Discipline from the same cluster as of DSC.
- •Students securing highest CGPA (above 6.0) and with no back paper shall be allowed to change his or her core course only once after completion of second semester. However, if a student desires to change one of his/her minors to core paper, then automatic change in the minor should be done as the same subject cannot be opted as both core and minor. Also change of core may be allowed only within allied subjects.



- •For IDC, Student have to opt any one subject from the bunching of Natural Science/Social Science/ Humanities/ Commerce and Management (ANNEXURE II) other than DSC and DSM subject. IDC courses opted shall remain same for all three semesters. Semester wise change of IDC is not allowed.
 - •SEC shall have to be opted either from DSC or from DSM 1 i.e first minor.
 - •Opting one literature as DSC and other literatures as DSM and IDC are not allowed.
 - In lieu of MIL, Alternative English may be opted by a student

ADMISSION PROCEDURE:

The new academic session of the college begins from August, after summer vacation. Application form for admission in FYUG courses will be available online in the college website http://www.sscollegehkd.ac.in. Student can apply through this online portal of the college. However the student have to create an Academic Bank of Credit (ABC ID) by visiting https://www.abc.gov.in/and also have to submit all details in the Samarth eGov portal of Govt of Assam https://assamadmission.samarth.ac.in/. A minimal registration fee of Rs 50 may be collected while registering in the Samarth portal. A sum of Rs 100/- (Rupees one hundred) with an additinal gateway charge will be collected through online transfer as application fees. The detailed procedure for filling up the online form is available in the admission portal. It is advisible to read the guideline and prospectus carefully before proceeding with the online form fill up. Student Email address and mobile no will be mandatory for online form submission. Admission to the college is made strictly on merit basis and as per Government Rerservation Policy. EXAMINATION:

For HS and FYUG course, the final examinations will be held as per the schedules of the AHSEC and Assam University respectively. Other than the final examinations, the students are required to appear the sessional test, unit test, seminar etc. conducted by the college, failing which the students will be considered as disqualified for appearing in the final examination.

MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION: English

LIBRARY & LIBRARY RULES: The College houses a computerized library having sufficient numbers of text and reference books, journals, news papers and periodicals. At present the library has more than 20 thousand titles in various faculties. Students are required to produce library card to avail of library facilities. The library is open on all working days from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

All the departments of the Science faculty have well equipped Laboratories.

EXCURSION / FIELD TRIPS /INTERNSHIP/COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT:

The college has the provision for yearly excursion of the students. Apart from that, as per FYUG guideline the students have to participate in internship/Community Engagement/ filed trip etc for 2 credit in 5th semester. Students getting admitted to Bio-Science combination (Zoology, Botany Industrial Fish and Fisheries & Chemistry) in the degree level are required to go for local and outstation excursion / field trips along with respective departmental teacher (s) / guide (s) as per instruction of the syllabus. For this purpose an additional fee will be collected by the respective department as per their requirments.

GAMES & SPORTS:

The college is having its own play field. Various games and sports facilities are available in the college.

COLLEGE IDENTITY CARD:

Every student is required to avail of the college Identity Card issued by the authority without fail. Old Identity Cards are to be surrendered at the end of the academic session for renewal.

Code of Conduct and General Instructions......
